

Sister Ann O'Brien Scholarship

The Sister Ann O'Brien Scholarship was established by friends and family in recognition of her many years of dedicated direct service in the field of social work in Saskatoon. The Scholarship valued at \$1,000.00 (full-time) or \$500.00 (part-time) annually is open to residents of Saskatchewan registered at a recognized University for studies in a Masters or Doctoral Degree program in Social Work, Psychology or Educational Psychology. Consideration will also be given to students who are in the final year of a Bachelor of Social Work program of study.

PROCEDURE

1. Applicants must submit a Curriculum Vitae, c/o Catholic Family Services Foundation of Saskatoon. Please include education, interests, previous experience, unofficial university transcripts and career goals. Please include letters of reference with the application.
2. The successful applicant will be chosen by an independent committee established by the Board of Directors of Catholic Family Services of Saskatoon.

4. Applications must be submitted on or before May 31st of the year in which the student plans to pursue studies.
5. Applicants shall be notified of the Committee's decision on or before July 31st.
6. The successful applicant must submit proof of registration by September 30th of the same year.
7. The successful applicant will receive the scholarship on or before January 10th of the following year.

SELECTIONS

Preference will be given to applicants who:

1. indicate a strong preference to work in the province of Saskatchewan in the area of direct human service delivery;
2. demonstrate financial need;
3. have demonstrated superior academic standing or practical experience.

ESTABLISHMENT OF SELECTION COMMITTEE

The Scholarship Selection Committee is chosen from the Board of Directors of Catholic Family Services (Foundation) and is representative of the community.
